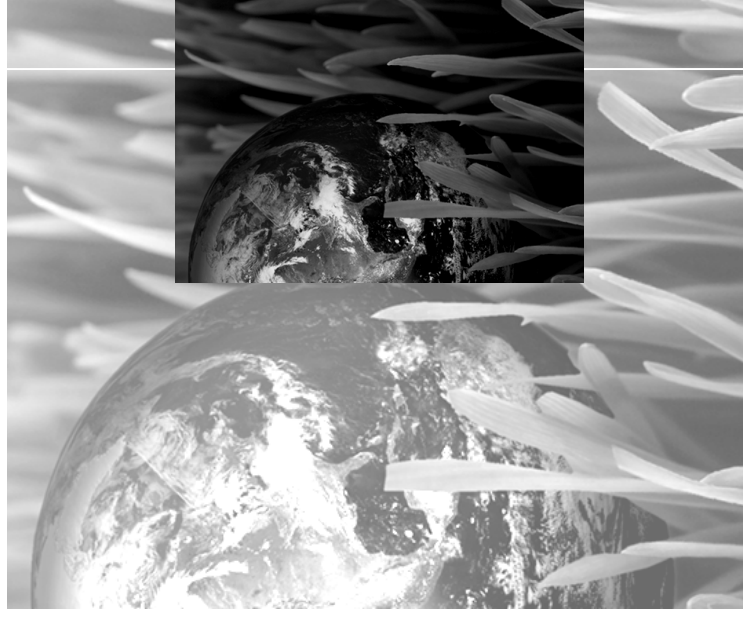

Climate change policy at all levels of government continues to evolve at a rapid pace: The U.S. Congress is actively debating economy-wide regulation, with the House passing a bill last summer and the Senate gearing up to tackle legislation this spring; EPA is moving forward with greenhouse gas regulations in response to the Supreme Court's *Massachusetts v. EPA* decision; and states throughout the Northeast region are undertaking a number of climate related initiatives.

This continuing legal education program will provide participants with the latest developments on each of these fronts. EPA Assistant Administrator Gina McCarthy will provide an overview of EPA's agenda for regulating greenhouse gases under the Clean Air Act. She will be followed by a panel of federal climate change policy experts who will review and evaluate the prospects for federal legislation. The program will conclude with a discussion of action at the state level, focused on the proposed regional low carbon fuel standard and the impact of state requirements on how companies approach climate change from regulatory and business perspectives.
